



Financial Aid Next Step Reminders

We're here to help ensure the financial aid you qualify for is applied to your student account. To make this happen as quickly as possible, there are a few important tasks you'll need to complete. Use this checklist to stay on track and organized!

- Activate** your [BlueM@il](#) account after submitting your deposit or intent to enroll form. Our office will use this email address to send you important future communications.
- Monitor** your [Financial Aid](#) in Campus Connect (click the Financial Aid tile) for important information and updates to your offer.
- Submit** all required documents as soon as possible to avoid delays in processing your financial aid. Your [To Do](#) list in Campus Connect (click the Tasks tile) outlines your specific requirements and next steps. Be sure to check your email and To Do list regularly, as we may need additional information to keep things moving smoothly.
- Enable [Share My Information](#)** to grant your parent, guardian, or another designated guest access to specific parts of your student record, such as financial aid, that you choose to share.
- Review** the [terms](#) of your federal, state, and scholarship aid and scholarships to ensure you understand your rights, responsibilities, renewal requirements, and other essential details.
- Accept, Reduce or Decline** your loans in [Campus Connect](#) to ensure your funds are disbursed on time.
- Complete** your [Entrance Counseling](#) and [Master Promissory Note \(MPN\)](#) loan requirements as soon as possible—loans cannot be disbursed until these steps are finished. Use your [To Do](#) list in Campus Connect (click the Tasks tile) for detailed instructions and next steps. If your parent is borrowing a PLUS Loan, remind them to complete their [PLUS Loan MPN](#) to avoid delays in processing.
- DePaul's Payment Plans** are interest-free and come with a low enrollment fee. For more details, refer to our [payment plan](#) information on our website.
- Read** the [Satisfactory Academic Progress](#) (SAP) policy to understand how staying academically on track helps you maintain financial aid eligibility and manage your costs effectively.
- Renew** your [FAFSA](#)! It becomes available on October 1, and we need it to create your financial aid package for the next academic year.
